

October is World Mission Month



Jesus' mission of creating a world where all can live a fully dignified life is still far from completion. Therefore, the Church dedicates the entire month of October to reflect on the central mission of the Church: spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ to the ends of the earth.

As part of Mission Month, World Mission Sunday is celebrated on the next-to-last Sunday in October in every Catholic church worldwide, from the grandest cathedral and smallest mission outstation. This year World Mission Sunday is celebrated on October 24, 2021.

On that day, Catholics of the world unite at Mass to recommit themselves to their vocation, through Baptism, to be missionaries. We are called in a special way to stand up for our faith through prayer and participation in the Eucharist, and by giving generously to the collection for the missions. This year's theme set by the Holy Father is:

World Mission Sunday was established by Pope Pius XI in 1926. He saw it as a way to “foster understanding of the greatness of the missionary task, encourage zeal among the clergy and the people, and offer an opportunity to make the Society for the Propagation of the Faith (a Pontifical Mission Society like the Missionary Childhood Association) ever more widely known and encourage offerings for the missions.”

Why Mission?

All people should be able to experience the joy of being loved by God and the joy of His salvation! It is a gift that we cannot keep to ourselves – it must be shared.
